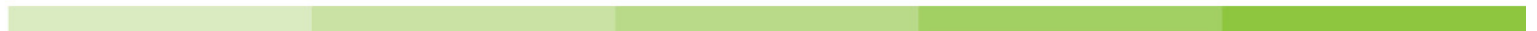

New areas for focus

Increasing cost of standing still - the limits to medicine

- Looking outside the health bubble - from firefighting to prevention
- Address silo mentality to support societal and environmental evaluation
- Forward projection of health care budget impact
- Fitness for purpose of health care systems



Policy Issues

- EuNetHTA - emphasis is on faster access - broaden from Single use/monopoly model to Multiple use/market
- From HTA to Health Process Assessment and to Health Service Assessment/Appraisal
- National agencies as role models
- Interaction between competing policy agendas (Innovation for Growth, CAVOMP, VBP)



Dissemination

- Classic - lay summary, journal articles, endorsement by others, public launch
- Conferences - ISPOR, HTAi, Gastein etc
- 3rd party advocates (Patients, Clinicians etc)
- 1:1 implementation with national agencies (especially where there is active change)
- Funding for exploring the costs of adopting a societal benefit approach
